






# **Honouring All Abilities**

Failure to do so will result in your application being considered inactive and subsequently removed from the waiting list and department files.



# TIPS FOR SAFETY DURING HOLIDAY SEASON



# **Vehicle:**

- Do not leave parcels and/or packages in plain view in your vehicle
- Lock all valuables in the trunk and keep windows & doors locked

# Personal Safety:

- While out shopping, park in a well-lit area
- Carry a minimal amount of cash
- Be cautious when using ATM machines, use machines in heavy populated areas
- Be aware of your surroundings

# **Home Safety:**

- If you will be away for the holidays, leave a light on or have someone stay there
- Test your smoke alarms & carbon monoxide
- Blow out any candles when leaving your home and unplug lights and decorations
  - Do not keep presents wrapped under the tree until necessary (especially if visible through window or door)

# Child Safety:

- Make sure your children know their phone number, full name and address
- Teach your children about internet safety and never give out personal information on the computer
- Caution children to never accept a ride home from anyone unless you told them it's okay
- Teach children how to use 911
- Make sure your children know how to reach you at work or on your cell phone.
