



Plastic and cans can be put into one container together (Not in bags)

Clean cardboard only cut down to just bigger than cereal box size and tied or put into a container (not just out loose)

Acceptable blue box items:

- √ #1 Plastic containers
 - Pop bottles
 - Water bottles
 - Lids and caps are not recyclable
 - #2 plastic containers
 - Detergent bottles
 - Shampoo bottles

- √ Steel (tin) food cans
- ✓ Aluminum food and beverage cans
- √ Pop cans

Acceptable yellow box items:

✓ Clean cardboard/box board

Please Note: Bagged items will not be collected.







*This training is for *all* community members, to use as you provide support to those in your communities; if you're interested in <u>working</u> as a Peer Worker, the requirements are listed below.


