#### 4 Day Work Week Pilot Project Information

As you may have heard, Batchewana First Nation has taken a proactive step to help create a healthier work-life balance for staff and is piloting a 4-day work week beginning May 23, 2023. The intent of the 4-day work week is to promote employee mental, physical and spiritual well-being, while maintaining or increasing productivity, as well as to show our appreciation.

Adopting a 4-day week is part of a growing movement centered on investing in employee wellness so that our staff members can be in a good place to provide service to others. This trial is modelled after a global pilot – the theme is 100% pay, scheduled 80% of the time, in exchange for 100% productivity.

The research has shown that a 4-day work week increases life and job satisfaction, physical and mental health while decreasing stress and burnout. The intention is to look after our staff so that they will stay with us and continue to look after our community members.

Please see the attached schedule that includes a summary of hours for all BFN service areas as well as emergency contact numbers. We have asked each area to define types of situations that would constitute an "emergency" so please stay tuned for that information which will come directly from the various service areas.

The 4 Day work week pilot is currently scheduled to conclude on October 6, 2023. Prior to that time, the success of the trial will be evaluated and service satisfaction from the community will be a factor. Continuation of the pilot schedule will depend on the results of this evaluation. We want to stress that members should see minimal change to the delivery of programs/services.

It is hoped that this innovative initiative will be supported as we endeavour to give our workers time to look after themselves, reconnect with their families and the community.

#### Canada invests in the modernisation of Rankin Arena in Batchewana First Nation

Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, May 24, 2023 — Today, Terry Sheehan, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Labour and Member of Parliament for Sault. Ste. Marie, and Dean Sayers, Chief of Batchewana First Nation, announced a federal investment of \$2,994,244 to modernize the Rankin Arena in Batchewana First Nation.

The Rankin Arena is the largest community building in Batchewana First Nation, used for gatherings, sport and recreation, and programming. Through this investment, the community will be able to renovate the arena's envelope, roof, and doors. These upgrades will make it more energy efficient, accessible, and functional, and safer for users and staff. The arena will have lower operating costs, which will enable it to extend its operating hours to the benefit of all residents.



These enhancements are expected to reduce the arena's energy consumption by an

estimated 14.5% and greenhouse gas emissions by 39.9 tonnes annually.

By investing in infrastructure, the Government of Canada is growing our country's economy, building resilient communities, and improving the lives of Canadians.

## Medical Transportation Outside the Sault Ste. Marie Area



Do you require assistance with medical transportation and associated costs to attend a medical appointment outside the Sault Ste. Marie area?

Batchewana First Nation can assist BFN members who require assistance to attend a medical appointment outside of the Sault Ste. Marie area, through the Non-Insured Benefits Program.

Assistance can be provided through such supports as advancement of funds for mileage and meals, securing accommodations, alternative transportation, etc.

- Submission of notice of appointment must be received no later then 10 days prior to the scheduled appointment, but preferable within two weeks of appointments.
- 2. Required information:
  - Full Name (first, middle & last name)
  - First Nation Registration/Status #
  - Date of Birth
  - Phone Number(s)
  - Residential Address
  - Doctors Note with:
  - ✓ Appointment Date, Time, Address,
  - √ Type of appointment
  - ✓ Specialists Contact Information

- **Escort Note** from Doctor (if client requires an escort)
- Notice of appointment and copy of referral (if required)
- Post Confirmation of Appointment Attendance from previous appointment (if required)
- 3. NIHB medical transportation will be coordinated with client and Batchewana Health Centre. Any change orders after the initial one (1) request performed by BFN staff will be limited to two (2) subsequent changes. Any further requests will be considered on a discretionary basis considering exceptional circumstances and/or clients will be directed to make their own arrangements directly with NIHB Regional for their direct approval and reimbursement.
- 4. Submission of Confirmation of Appointment attendance is due back to the BFN Staff member at the Batchewana Health Centre within 2 weeks of your appointment attendance. Failure to submit your confirmation of appointment attendance will jeopardize your ability to receive future financial supports.

Failure to supply all required documentation as requested, may result in a delay in application, approval and financial assistance.

There is **NO Guarantee** that applications will be approved, if they are submitted less than 10 days prior to medical appointment.
