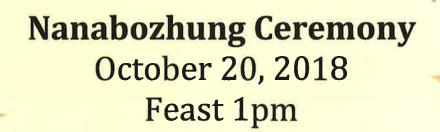

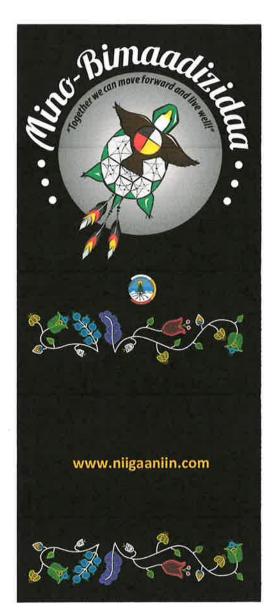

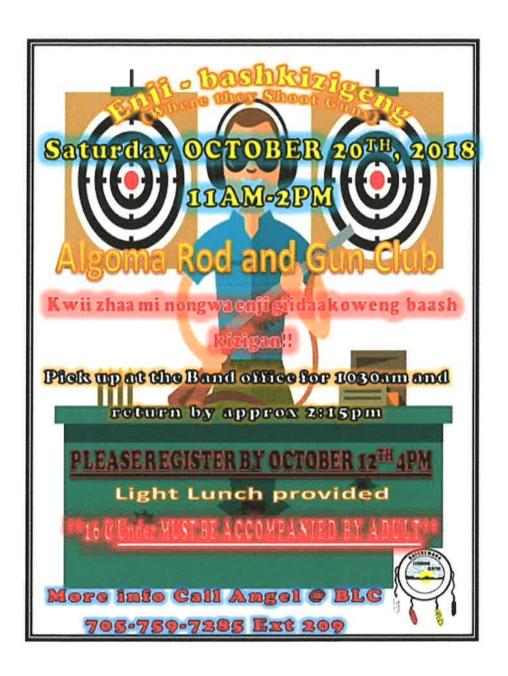

High school students will receive \$75.00 once their timetable is handed into the office with a copy of their status card.

Students living on the reserve but not status are eligible for funding under the grandmother clause of the Indian Act.
