Batchewana First Nation would like to thank everyone who helped put together the Christmas Parade and the Memorial Tree lighting ceremony this year.


We had an excellent turn out and it's all because of the dedicated individuals who worked tirelessly to put these events together and to the community members who came out to show support.

Batchewana First Nation Guidelines for LNHL 2017

For the purposes of the following document all rostered players mean: Registered Batchewana Band Members or Children of Batchewana Band Members (one Parent rule), and Children of Batchewana Band Members whom are registered with another First Nation, but playing for the Batchewana Attack.

- 1. For 2017 LNHL, a registration form will be filled in for each player participating at LNHL. Attached to this form will be a copy of the Child's Status card or if playing under a Parent's Status card then a copy of the parent's Status card and a copy of the child's long form birth certificate. If your child is playing for another team because Batchewana Attack has no division available for them, and will be requesting financial assistance, a Parent must complete a form notifying Batchewana First Nation. This form is required for budget purposes, and due the same time as registration. Teams will be formed from these registrations. Priority to be rostered to a team, will be given to Batchewana First Nation Members or Children of Batchewana First Nation Members. No releases will be provided to Batchewana First Nation Members or Children of Batchewana First nation Members, if Batchewana has a team registered in that division. Deadline for registration is December 16, 2016. All Batchewana Attack Team Personnel must complete a registration form for administrative purposes.
- 2. Each Team may have a maximum of 4 adults assigned to that team, with the exception of Tyke which may have 5. These positions are Manager, Coach, Assistant Coach, Trainer, and for Tyke an additional Assistant Coach. Preference will be given to Parents/Guardians of children playing for that team. (Can only volunteer with one Batchewana Attack Team, all Team Personnel will be required to have completed all certification required by LNHL.)
- 3. Financial assistance maybe provided to each rostered player, to be determined each year by submission of budget to Chief and Council for their approval.
- 4. Upon approval a meal allowance will be provided to each child rostered to play for the Batchewana Attack. No meal allowance will be provided to Coaches, Managers or Trainers.
- 5. Upon approval a travel allowance will be provided to each Family with a child rostered to play for the Batchewana Attack participating at LNHL. The amount of this allowance will be dependent on where LNHL is being held. If a family with 3 or more rostered players and are required to be at different arenas at the same time, and are traveling in more than one vehicle, a request for an additional travel allowance can be submitted in writing to the LNHL Coordinator, these request will be dealt with on an individual basis.
- 6. Upon approval accommodations will be provided to each player rostered to play for Batchewana Attack at the Hotel chosen as the Host Hotel. In the event that more than one child is playing for a Batchewana attack team,

only one room will be provided per Family. If an additional room is required because of the size of the family based on 3 or more players rostered, then a request can be submitted in writing to the LNHL Coordinator, these request will be approved on an individual basis. If a Coach, Trainer or Manager volunteering with a Batchewana Attack team has no children rostered to play, no accommodations will be provided.

- 7. Coaches, Managers or Trainers volunteering for Batchewana Attack will be provided the travel allowance only. If a Coach, Manager or Trainer has a child rostered to play for Batchewana Attack they will not receive any additional financial assistance.
- 8. If there is no division for a Batchewana Band member to play for and they play for another team, a stipend will be awarded to each Batchewana Band Member, based on the amount for each Child approved by Chief and Council. If the player rostered elsewhere has a sibling rostered with the Batchewana Attack, only a food allowance will be provided.
- 9. If any player receives additional financial assistance from their own First Nation or their Parent/Guardians First Nation for the above expenses, the amount received will reduce the stipend allotted to rostered players on any team.
- 10. If a player is rostered to play with a team other than the Batchewana Attack, (no team available) and require financial assistance, they must participate in the fund raising activities planned each year.
- 11. All Fundraising done in the efforts to raise funds for Batchewana First Nation's participation at LNHL, shall be done as a whole and all money raised shall be deposited with Batchewana First Nation to be used for financial assistance for rostered players. If fundraising is done by Non Band Members playing for the Batchewana Attack they will receive a portion of the net funds based on total rostered players. For 2017 a 50/50 Raffle will be one of the main fund raising events. Each BFN funded player must sell 4 books of tickets, if that Family has more than one rostered player, 2 additional books will be required to be sold per player. Non- Band Members will be given the option of participating in this event. For every book of tickets sold by a Non- Band Member rostered to play for BFN, they will receive half of all their individual tickets proceeds. This money will be distributed at the Host Hotel on March 12th2017. If BFN funded players do not sell their required 4 books of tickets their travel allowance to LNHL 2017 will be reduced.
- 12. If financial assistance is being provided, all monies will be available for pickup at the Host Hotel upon arrival. A note to parents of players receiving financial assistance will be issued prior to leaving for LNHL so they know where to pick up their money and how much they will receive. If the travel portion of your funding is required prior to traveling to LNHL, please notify the LNHL Coordinator before March 03, 2017 for pick up March 8th and 9th 2017.
- 13. It is mandatory that as a rostered player at LNHL you must be in attendance at every game your team is scheduled to play. Attendance will be kept and if a player has missed a game, a portion of their allotted stipend must be returned, this is at the discretion of the team Manager.
- 14. All Batchewana Attack uniforms and equipment are the property of Batchewana First Nation. It is the responsibility of each team Manager to sign out equipment and or uniforms required by their team, and return them immediately to the Administration Office after LNHL. The sweaters will be cleaned and stored at the Rankin Arena.

Access for First Nations individuals to the Non-Insured Health Benefits Program

As you may know, through the Non-insured Health Benefits (NIHB) Program, eligible clients may access a range of health related benefits including medications, dental benefits, medical supplies and equipment, vision care, mental health counselling and transportation to medical appointments. To be eligible for NIHB Program benefits, a First Nations person must be registered under the *Indian Act* with Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC).

A report on "Access to Health Services for Remote First Nations Communities," tabled as part of the spring 2015 report of the Auditor General of Canada, identified that some First Nations individuals had not registered and therefore may not be able to access benefits under the NIHB Program.

In order to allow parents time to register their children, infants up to the age of one may access NIHB benefits under a parent who is NIHB eligible. However, after the child's first birthday, registration is required to ensure continued eligibility for NIHB benefits.

Registering is an individual choice; however, Health Canada wants to raise awareness of the importance of registration to ensure access to benefits under the NIHB Program.

APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION OF A CHILD UNDER THE INDIAN ACT

GUIDELINES FOR COMPLETION OF APPLICATION

The information you provide in this document is collected under the authority of the *Indian Act* for the purpose of registration under that *Act* and will be stored in personal information bank number INA/P-PU-110. Personal information that you provide is protected under the provisions of the *Privacy Act*.

Persons wishing to register a child born before April 17, 1985 should complete the following form to the extent possible using these guidelines.

If you fall into one of the following categories, you are entitled to be registered under the Act.

- 1. Persons entitled to be registered prior to April 17, 1985.
- 2. Women who lost status through marriage to a man who was not a status Indian (s.12(1)(b)).
- 3. Children of women referred to in 1 who were enfranchised upon their mother's marriage (s.109(2)).
- 4. Children whose mother and whose father's mother did not have status under the *Act* before their marriage, who lost status at age 21 (s.12(1)(a)(iv) referred to commonly as the double-mother rule).
- 5. Illegitimate children of women with status under the *Act* whose registration was successfully protested on the ground that their father was a man who did not have status under the *Act*.
- 6. Persons enfranchised upon application by the head of the household (s.109(1) or its predecessor section).
- 7. Children of persons listed in 1 to 6 above.
- 8. Illegitimate daughters of status Indian men and women without status, born before April 17, 1985.

PART A

Applications are to be signed by both parents or guardians on behalf of minor children or mentally incompetent persons. If only one parent signs, attach a note explaining why the second signature is not available. Guardians must attach a copy of the Court Order granting guardianship. Persons 18 or over applying for themselves are to use the white form entitled APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION OF AN ADULT UNDER THE *INDIAN ACT* 83-044E.

PART B

If the person on whose behalf you are applying is from categories 2 to 6, you should include the former band number if known and the name of the former band.

The LONG FORM BIRTH REGISTRATION for each child on which the parents' names are indicated is required.

PART C

If you do not know the band number of the parents, leave it blank. It is important however to name the band with which each person is affiliated.

PART D

You should refer to the categories listed above for the wording. Details such as dates of marriage, enfranchisement order or protest should be included, if known.

New Year New People


